
THE WORD THIS WEEK

The second of the great Gospels of Scrutiny challenges how (well) we see: 'Man looks at appearances, but the Lord looks at the heart' God tells Samuel. The Disciple, the neighbours, the pharisees, the jewish authorities all fail to see the man born blind – it's the classic 'does he take sugar' scenario. The only one who sees clearly is the blind man! As we prepare for Easter and hope for light out of darkness, we pray that we may wake from our sleep and our eyes also may be opened by the spittle and touch of Jesus, the Light of the world.


MASS will continue to be said, privately, each day



THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC FAITH

Part One: **THE PROFESSION OF FAITH.** Section One: **‘I Believe’ – ‘We Believe’**

Article 3: **SACRED SCRIPTURE** III. **The Holy Spirit, Interpreter of Scripture**

(112) *Be especially attentive ‘to the content and unity of the whole Scripture’.* Different as the books which compose it may be, Scripture is a unity by reason of the unity of God's plan, of which Christ Jesus is the centre and heart, open since his Passover. (Cf. Luke 24:25-27, 44-46.)

“The phrase ‘heart of Christ’ can refer to Sacred Scripture, which makes known his heart, closed before the Passion, as the Scripture was obscure. But the Scripture has been opened since the Passion; since those who from then on have understood it, consider and discern in what way the prophecies must be interpreted.” (Saint Thomas Aquinas, *Expos. In Psalm 21, 11; cf. Psalm 22:14.*)

THE BISHOPS OF ENGLAND AND WALES have issued the following advice for the Church in the face of the coronavirus pandemic we are currently enduring:

The public celebration of Mass should cease from the evening of Friday 20th March. This includes Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation: The obligation for the Faithful to attend Mass on these days is removed until further notice owing to the extraordinary circumstances.

A notice should be put on the church door to explain that the church is open for private prayer, but there are no public services, in accordance with coronavirus guidelines against large groups of people gathering.
